May 2014 be prosperous for you all!





I wanted to thank everyone for their kind words of condolences following the death of our child this past November. It was and is very hard, but God continues to bless us and comfort us. With that in mind, I thought this would be a good article, "Where Do Babies Go When They Die?" I've tried to be universally Christian in my articles, but this is an issue of which there is no universality. You must fall in one of three camps: All of them go to Heaven, None of them go to Heaven.

There are many groups who believe that a profession of faith or a knowledge and understanding of Christ's work on the cross must be attained before salvation can work. But as a baby, let alone an unborn baby, cannot make this informed decision, it causes uncomfortable questions.

Some people stick to their guns and glumly tell parents that as much as it grieves them, they're sorry but their child has no salvation. The Catholic Church tries to lessen the blow and tells parents that their child is in Limbo. This nether region between Heaven and Hell where they must remain because they were not baptized. Well, I'll only say that you will not the word "limbo" in the Bible. As for ALL babies going to Hell, I cringe at the concept of it. I understand the argument, but I cannot rationally believe that a God who sent His own Son to be a ransom for many, would automatically sentence my child to the flames of Hell because they were never born or never came to knowledge of Christ.



That argument then launches into the group that believes that all babies go to Heaven. They rationalize this with an "age of accountability" argument. They believe that unless the child is old enough to accept or reject Christ's salvation, they cannot be held accountable. Some even go so far as to proclaim universal salvation for all, adults and children. Sadly, this is bad theology as Jesus, Himself, said that there is a Hell and people will go there in Matthew 5:22. Furthermore, you will not find the term "age of accountability" anywhere in the Bible, either. Finally, the argument falls apart when you realize that if there truly were an "age of accountability", then it would be more merciful for me to strangle my son, Clark, in his bed and therefore guarantee that he will dwell eternally in Heaven, rather than let him grow up and run the risk he might go to Hell.

The only argument that makes sense and is consistent in Scripture is the position that some babies go to Heaven. Sometimes referred to as limited atonement or election or predestination. In other words, it is Romans 8:29-30, "For those whom he foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the image of his Son, in order that he might be the firstborn among many brothers. And those whom he predestined he also called, and those whom he called he also justified, and those whom he justified he also glorified."

If God predestined certain adults to be the recipients of Christ's ransom, then it stands to reason that the same is true for babies, born or unborn, as well as those who are mentally handicapped and otherwise unable to understand the message of salvation. The Bible tells us that Christ is the shepherd who has come in search for us in Luke 15:3-7. I John 4:19 tells that we love Christ because He first loved us. It is therefore not about what we do, but about what Christ has done for us.

This is the only teaching that is consistent. Rather than make up places and doctrines, or leave grieving parents in anguish, it simply sticks to the word of God and pronounces it for both adults and babies. And as Christ's adopted brother, I believe that my Brother has prepared a place for my child in Heaven where I will dwell with my child and the Lord forever.


This month, Engineering was busy with the ancient art of blacksmithing.

Evan has achieved a forge weld (actually melting two pieces of metal into one) in the small portable forge we built. This required real hardwood chunk charcoal, not the briquettes which only got our metal up to red and can contain

Wood charcoal Mineral char (Lignite/brown coal) Mineral carbon (coal) Limestone (ash colorant) Starch (binder) Borax (release agent) Sodium nitrate (accelerant)

Sawdust

Wax (some brands: binder, accelerant, ignition facilitator). Chaff (Rice chaff and peanut chaff)



A lot of sticks. Those big cookie tins or popcorn tins will work.

Poke a hole or two in the bottom or low on the sides with a nail and then fill with chunks of sticks 1.5-2 inches in diameter.

Packing tight is fine as long as the lid goes back on airtight.

Build a small fire with some of the rest of the yard trash, pine cones, pine, smaller or larger oak sticks from your yard, and place the box on top. Continue feeding the fire under and around the box and after an hour or so, the wood will essentially distill -producing gases which will burn - jetting out the holes or from around the lid depending on how tight it fits.

After the gas fire stops, you can let the outside fire go down and take the tin off. When cool, check your charcoal, it should look pretty much the same only lighter, smaller and black.

If you just have ashes, too much air got in.

if you break a chunk and it has wood inside, pop the lid back on, feed your fire and cook it a while longer.

With this, you can get up to the light yellow to white heat sufficient for forget welding.

And it also isn't bad on the grill.






