Message from the CO - FLEET CAPTAIN JOHN YELVERTON



When I was six years old, I used to love watching "Lost in Space." Though even at six, I noticed that their weapons NEVER worked. One day, I came in late from playing outside, and when I ran to the TV to watch "Lost in Space", it wasn't on. Instead, there was this man in a yellow shirt fighting a giant lizard. My mom told me it was "Star Trek", and that the channel wasn't going to show "Lost in Space" anymore. That was my first exposure to "Star Trek", and needless to say, it didn't go over very well.

Ten years later, I was sixteen years old at a Bible Conference in Newport News, Virginia. We were set up in the dormitories at the college where the conference was held at, but there was only one TV in the whole building. Every night at 9:00 for an entire week, the only option you had was watching "Star Trek" or nothing. The very first episode that I saw, was "Obsession".

When we were driving back home, the driver of the church van fell asleep at the wheel. The van drove up a hill outside of Birmingham and flipped end over end back down the hill. I was taken to UAB, and there it was discovered that I had broken my neck. They performed emergency surgery by taking bone out of my hip and splicing it to my neck column to keep me from paralyzing myself.

Message from Chief of Engineering - VADM Bethany Theilman



Engineering Report: Putting on our Vulcan Hats: Part I:

During the last couple months we have had some fun and some changes, and one historic vote in the US House of Representatives. The night at the ball park was fun, if damp. Engineering has not built anything in Jackson lately, but the Greenville division is busy cranking out hulls. We are obviously the training ship for fleet as we have lost Lucy and Chuck to Region 3 and Dr. Ricardo Lemus to Region 12. Evan is a high school graduate and will be attending the Engineering Academy at Dr. McCoy's alma mater, the University of Mississippi, Oxford, MS. Now, on to some troubling news....

Think of climate as a deck of cards with each degree of temperature rise adding an ace. Over time, the probability of the daily weather hands being stronger increases. - paraphrasing a quote by RADM David Titley, USN, Retired.

March 2014 Pentagon report found that climate change impacts are "threat multipliers," and that the rapid rise of global temperatures and associated extreme weather events could exacerbate issues like "poverty, environmental degradation, political instability and social tensions - conditions that can enable terrorist activity and other forms of violence."

However, just before Memorial Day weekend, the US House of Representatives slipped an amendment onto the Defense Authorization Act forbidding the US Military to even THINK about preparing for the effects of global warming. The vote was almost completely along party lines. In other words, the Navy cannot plan to raise its docking facilities and bases, prepare for operations in an increasingly ice-free Arctic, or collect or analyze data and create plans for various global threat scenarios caused by droughts or flooding.

In the next decade, Bangladesh's farmland will be half as productive due to flooding - with stronger typhoons feeding its 57 rivers - and rising seas that are already contaminating rice fields with saltwater. That will starve or displace 80 MILLION people who live on an average \$1.25 a day. They will have to migrate or die. Where will they go? Desperate people do desperate things like strap bombs to themselves - hence the military's concern.

Many US coastal cities are also within a couple meters of sea level, New Orleans is BELOW sea level, and Miami and Norfolk Virginia's many shipyards and military bases are AT sea level right now. We have already had a taste of multiple feet of extra water from Katrina on our own Mississippi coast, and even though it went away this time, that didn't work out so well.

How can over half the House of Representatives think that preparing for the future is a bad thing?

We will give them the benefit of a doubt and hope that schools and colleges are failing to teach people to recognize logical fallacies rather than think that they were politically motivated. Unlike the founding fathers who were Renaissance men with a healthy dose of skepticism, today's politicians and voters are not trained to rationally weigh evidence and there are people happy to take advantage of that for their own purposes. Rigorous logic must be applied to claims made by anyone: advertisers, media, scientists, politicians, or religious leaders, so I will spend the next few reports going over common logical fallacies to better arm the crew against them. Applying logic to interpreting the observed world in the Middle Ages led to the Renaissance and MIGHT save our asses now.

- Claims made by anyone must be first weighed logically for bias by asking: "Who sez?" "What are their credentials?" 'Who stands to profit by the claim made?" (In short: Follow the money.)
- Any claim to "Truth" or "Fact" must begin with the mountain of evidence which has withstood the test of being picked over by many other scientists hostile to the idea. Like the hard evidence from many sources that proves a mostly spherical earth goes around the center of the mass between the earth and sun. We have data: - measurements, shadows on the moon, photos from space, and analogous systems within and even outside our solar system. In short, we are 99.99999% sure of the mathematical and scientific concepts behind the claim which is why it is considered fact and should be taught in public school.

Anecdotal "Evidence"- the fallacy of using a personal experience or an isolated example instead of a sound argument or compelling evidence. Quantitative scientific measures are more accurate overall than personal perceptions and experiences, but our inclination is to believe that which is tangible to us, and/or the word of someone we trust over the more 'abstract' statistical reality. Anecdotal evidence is not, thus, based on clear, definitive fact, and as such, it is not generally considered useful or admissible in court.

Example: George said his grandfather smoked two packs a day and lived until 97 - so don't believe everything you read about meta-analyses of methodologically sound studies showing proven causal relationships.

The media is terribly guilty of this. They seem compelled to "give equal time" to things that aren't equal. Such as giving an individual talking about the unusually cold weather at their house equal air time with a climate scientist talking about global warming or gushing about the guy who ate snarfberries every day for a month and whose cancer went into remission and giving little or no time to the many studies showing snarfberries have no effect on cancer in double-blinded trials. (Of course the makers of snarfberries buy commercials....) This tendency has the unfortunate side effect of equating the validity of the points. Most viewers don't distinguish an anecdotal point data source from a massive data set.

universe, its history and laws.

Bandwagon Fallacy - The popularity of an idea has absolutely no bearing on its validity. Period. e.g.. The Earth was never flat in spite of the belief of the vast majority in the past. The supernatural exists! Or not. Sharks are dangerous!! Not as dangerous as driving to the beach is. Etc.

Burden of Proof is on the person making extraordinary claims, NOT those challenging them especially if the claim requires something supernatural or currently unverifiable. i.e.. When plate tectonics was proposed, the burden of proof was on those presenting the theory. It is now accepted as fact. Now that 97% of scientists agree that we are putting too much CO2 and methane into our atmosphere and that the ocean will rise because of it, it is those who do NOT believe that mankind is responsible and must stop the effects that must

prove their point or at least get out of the way of solving the problem and keeping the worst effects from kicking in.

Circular reasoning (also called Begging the Question)-An argument which often arises when people have an assumption that is very ingrained, and therefore taken in their minds as a given. Circular arguments simply restate the premise rather than proving it -assuming that everyone agrees the premise is true. The classic example is: The Word of God is flawless and perfect. We know this because it says so in the Bible, Koran, etc. More subtly: President Reagan was a great communicator because he had the knack of talking effectively to the people. This statement, while true, uses definition of premise as proof of premise. redundant and not a proof.

Composition/Division - A fallacy which assumes that what's true about one part of something has to be applied to all, or other, parts of it. For example, a treatise says the sky is blue and unicorns are real. Proving the sky is blue DOES NOT prove unicorns are real. Each claim made must be independently verified by an outside source that is itself scientifically sound. Straw man - Misrepresenting someone's argument to make it easier to attack.

By exaggerating, misrepresenting, or just completely fabricating someone's argument, it's much easier to present your own position as being reasonable, but this kind of dishonesty serves to undermine honest rational debate. (Hear that Congress?) Example: After Will said that we should put more money into health and education, Warren responded by saying that he was surprised that Will hates our country so much that he wants to leave it defenseless by cutting military spending. Remember! Science is a work in progress! As each new data point is discovered and tested, scientists better understand the

"AWAY MISSION" TO MS RESARCH SYMPOSIUM IN BIRMINGHAM:

Last Fall, I was elected to the Alabama-Mississippi Chapter of the MS Society's Board of Directors. The National MS Society held a research

symposium at the University of Alabama Birmingham June 19th. I got there by Greyhound Bus, which is something not-so-routine for a person using a wheelchair. With some glitches, I managed to get there and back so Greyhound got high marks.

While there, I went to a reception unveiling a unique sculpture called "Sentient Matrix" by Sara Garden Armstrong, depicting axonal pathways in the brain and spinal cord damaged in multiple sclerosis. The "sausage link" shaped structures are the myelin, or insulation around the axons (fibers) that enable much faster nerve conduction. When that myelin is damaged, as in multiple

sclerosis, signals slow from 250 mph to 10mph, and for many with progressive forms of the disease (like myself), the axon and nerve cells die, resulting in worsening disability.


To understand just how complex multiple sclerosis is, look at this slide (right) from the conference, entitled, "Immunopathogenesis of the MS Lesion".
