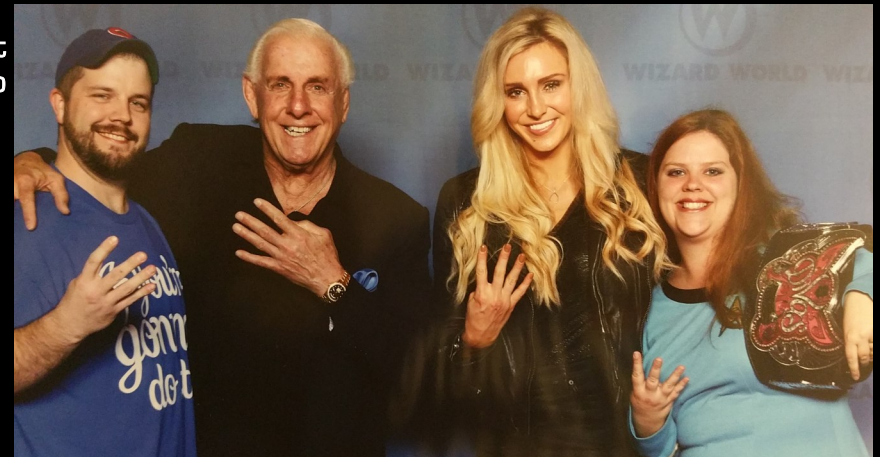
Message from XO - Fleet Captain Ryan Case

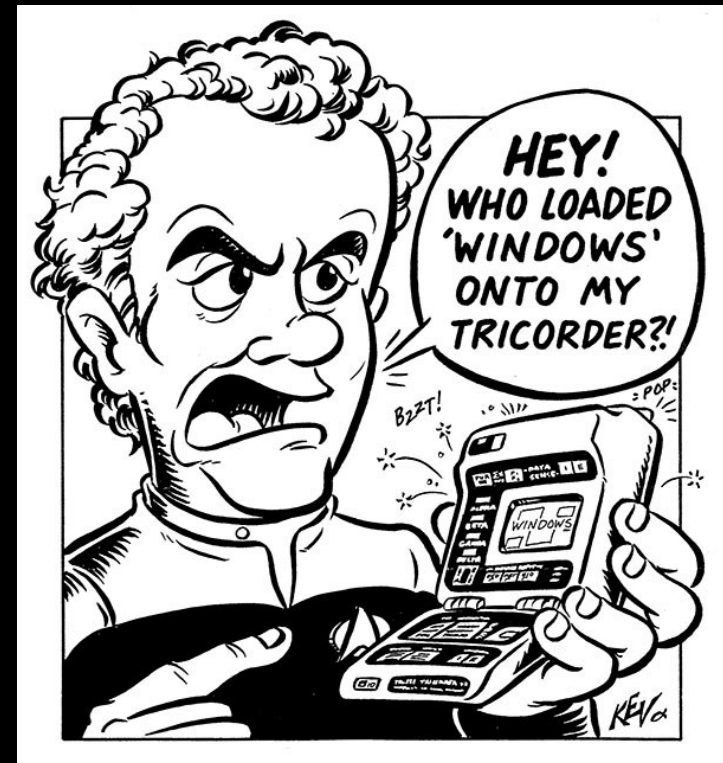

Hmmm. Interesting things that happened over the last quarter.

3600+ people at Gulfwars 25 survived being grazed by this St. Patty's Day tornado. There were only a couple ER visits (one was a concussion from falling tree, another was a sprain from slipping in mud.) I think we got off lucky.

I was on duty as front gate guard smiling pretty at new arrivals and checking badges (and running around and burping the rain pools off of my popup shelter.) People in cars kept looking concerned and telling me that there was a storm coming.

Then lightning struck close enough to feel and generated a lot of chatter on the radio. (We later found that it totaled Sir Dex's truck by frying everything electrical and damaged the electronics in several surrounding vehicles). There was briefly 1/2" hail and The Watch Commander started

hollering over the radio for everyone to get the populace into solid structures. I was deciding which ditch I would get into before the tornado hit as I was hearing the person at back gate calling in that their tent was blowing away. The sky was as black as I have ever seen and the wind/rain was pretty much straight sideways wind at 60 mph.

Then the huge white SUV drove up and it was like that "Come with me if you want to live" sequence in Terminator. I reported that I was abandoning my post. We drove a few hundred feet to the Meridian Royal camp to pick up my rescuers kids, and then in a couple minutes, we were doing site triage and driving around the camps near front gate sending in reports on amount of damage and whether people were hurt. He dropped me at The Watch and I ran to our camp to check on Evan who has his own exciting tale.

The next morning when I thanked the knight and gave him some woven silk trim for the rescue he said I had had big saucer eyes when he saw me. I believe it.

About 100% of modern tents filled with water. 40-50% of ALL tents were blown over - or apart. A lot of period canvas tents were destroyed/blown over. I heard that someone drove by the front gate popup tent I had been under, didn't see me and was freaking out since it was a tangle of spaghetti a few moments after I was rescued. The 20x40 foot Last Bastion meal plan tent had 1.5 inch steel poles bent into U's around a tree. Oddly enough, on the tables, was still some corned beef and cabbage sitting on plates.

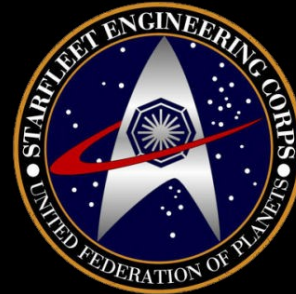

My tent simply fell over onto its spokes after a stake loop tore off and several other 18" stakes pulled out of the ground. I didn't get a photo cause the guys in camp just set it back up by putting the stakes back in. There was actually a dry towel hanging from the cross bar, but I can't believe how much grass and leaves were blown onto/into everything not in plastic tubbies. All the bedding was water dripping soaked plus wind debris so we just drove home and came back to pack up on Friday. Evan had rescued my basket and purse as soon as storm passed and taken it into the cottage after tent fell over so we didn't have to replace any important papers.

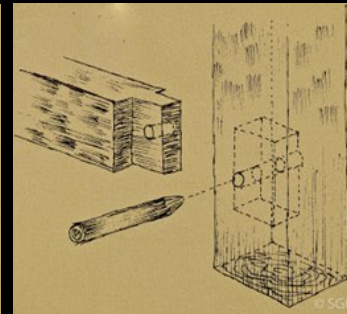
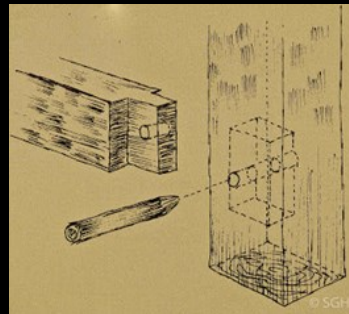


I had 2 trees die over the summer and another 7 were dead or terminal by March so I had them cut down and turned into lumber in my back yard.

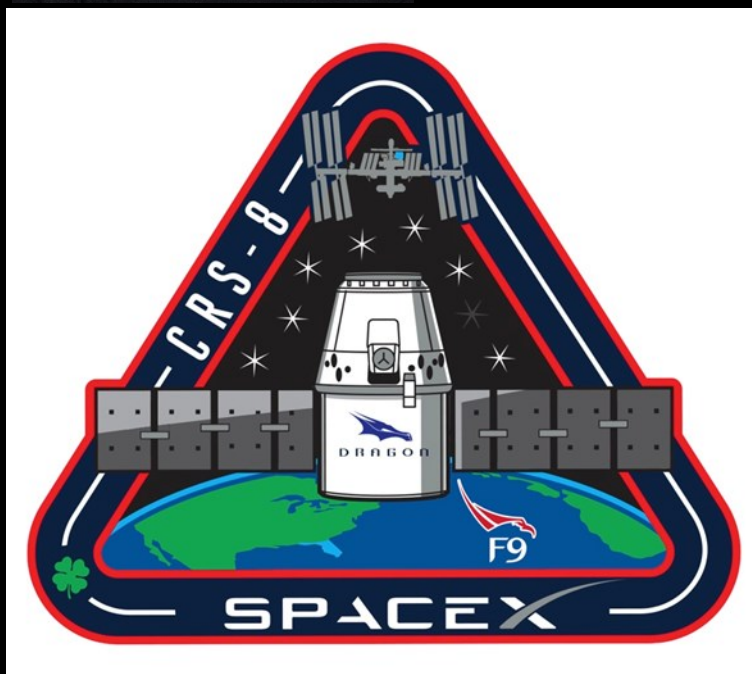

SPACE X CRS-8 "STICKS" THE LANDING:

After four very close "near misses", Space X's Crew Resupply Mission 8 (CRS-8) successfully landed the first stage of the Falcon 9 Rocket on a moving sea platform called, "Of Course I Still Love You." The technical challenges were daunting: carrying the extra fuel for a controlled reentry and landing; adequate reaction control thrusters; computer speed and reaction time...just to name a few. This is a huge leap forward because it dramatically reduces the cost of spaceflight. Congratulations to the entire Space X Team for their triumphant success!

I also met with some attorneys at the Department of Justice Disability Rights Section about continuing transportation problems and how to solve them. Specifically, enforcing a brand new Consent Decree calling for Greyhound to provide better service to individuals with disabilities.

Psychosocial and psychiatric issues during an expedition to Mars – from Wikipedia

There are a number of psychosocial and psychiatric issues that may have an impact on crew members during an expeditionary mission to Mars. In terms of selection, only a subset of all astronaut candidates will be willing to be away from family and friends for the two- to three-year mission, so the pool of possible crew members will be restricted and possibly skewed psychologically in ways that cannot be foreseen. Little is known about the physical and psychological impact of long-duration microgravity and the high radiation that occurs in deep space. In addition, on Mars the crew members will be subjected to a gravity field that is only 38 percent of Earth gravity, and the impact of this situation on their physical and emotional well-being is unknown. Given the long distances involved, the crew must function autonomously and develop their own work schedules and solve operational emergencies themselves. They must also be able to deal with medical and psychiatric emergencies, such as physical trauma due to accidents as well as suicidal or psychotic thinking due to stress and depression. Basic life support and staples such as water and fuel will need to be provided from resources on Mars and its atmosphere. There will be a great deal of leisure time (especially during the outbound and return phases of the mission), and occupying it meaningfully and flexibly may be a challenge.

Furthermore, during on-orbit or lunar missions a number of interventions have been implemented successfully to support crew member psychological well-being. These have included family conferences in real time (i.e., with no appreciable delays), frequent consultations with mission control, and the sending of gifts and favorite foods on resupply ships to enhance morale. Such actions have helped to provide stimulation and counter the effects of isolation, loneliness, asthenization, and limited social contact. But with the delays in crew-ground communication and the inability to send needed resupplies in a timely manner due to the vast distances between the habitats on Mars and Earth, the currently used Earth-based support strategies will be seriously constrained, and new strategies will be needed.

Finally, since gazing at the Earth's beauty has been rated as the major positive factor of being in space, the experience of seeing the Earth as an insignificant dot in the heavens may enhance the sense of isolation and produce increased feelings of homesickness, depression and irritability. This may be ameliorated by having a telescope on board with which to view the Earth, thus helping the crew feel more connected with home.

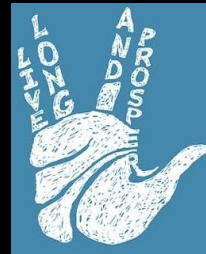
