### Message from the CO - COMMODORE JOHN YELVERTON

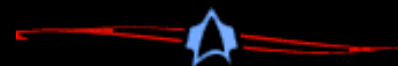

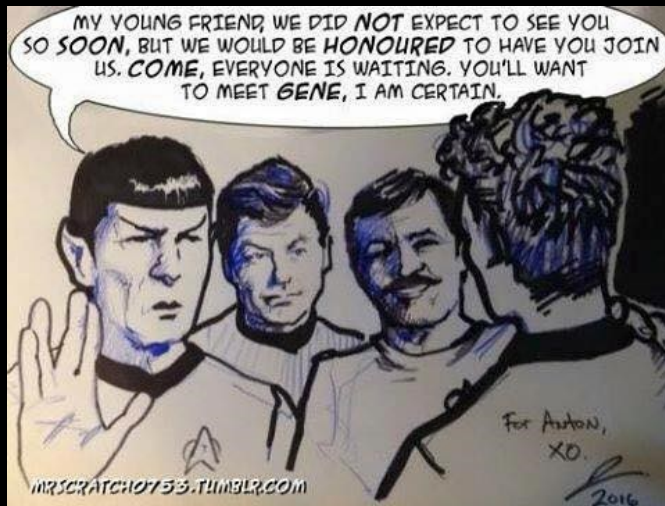

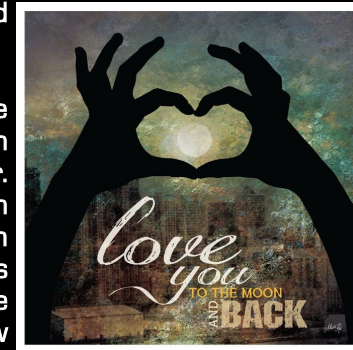

You're driving east on Interstate 10, you cross the colossally tall Pearl River bridge into Mississippi and suddenly there it is: a giant rocket stage boasting 5 massive F-1 engines, in the swamp, welcoming you into the Hospitality State. What is it? How did it get there?

It's the first of the three stages of a Saturn V rocket, the same rocket that was used by NASA to support the Apollo program, and took Neil Armstrong and 23 others into orbit around the moon and enabled 12 of them to actually walk on it. Only this one never flew. It was one of several pieces left over after Apollo 17, the last moon landing. Built for Apollo 19, this booster would have taken Mississippi native Fred Haise to the moon as mission commander. If it had, it would have splashed down successfully and ended up in bottom of the Atlantic Ocean. Instead, you can now see it from the highway or better yet, stand in awe in its shadow when you visit INFINITY.

The booster is INFINITY's most recent addition, having arrived at the science center in the early morning hours of June 21, 2016. Getting it here was just beginning of a multi-phase effort to restore it and build a permanent display. It will be quite the effort to move it and place it on permanent display. With enough people donating to conserve the rocket, and erect a glass and steel building around it for protection, together we can ensure that a significant piece of American space history will never fade from memory.

## Message from XO - Fleet Captain Ryan Case

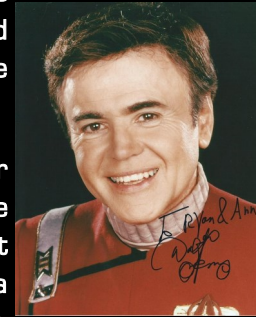

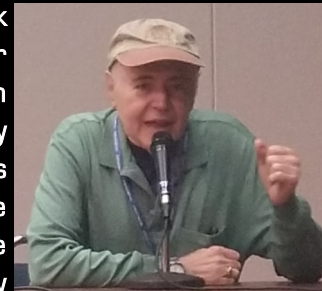

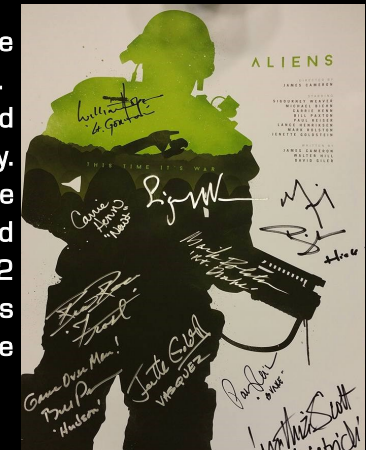

Santa Maria degli Angeli e dei Martiri: or How to keep track of religious holidays using the sun

At solar noon every sunny day, a ray of light pierces the gloom of the Santa Maria degli Angeli e dei Martiri in Rome. A church with a rather



unassuming exterior (by Roman standards), it is a section of the remaining structure of the Baths of Diocletian (Thermae Diocletiani, built about AD 300) on the Quirinal Hill of Rome. The inside, designed by Michelangelo makes up for the outside....

At the beginning of the eighteenth century, Pope Clement XI (1649-1721) commissioned Francesco Bianchini (1662-1729) to build a meridian line within the basilica to check the accuracy of the Gregorian reformation of the calendar (1582). Since Easter moved around, you had to be sure.

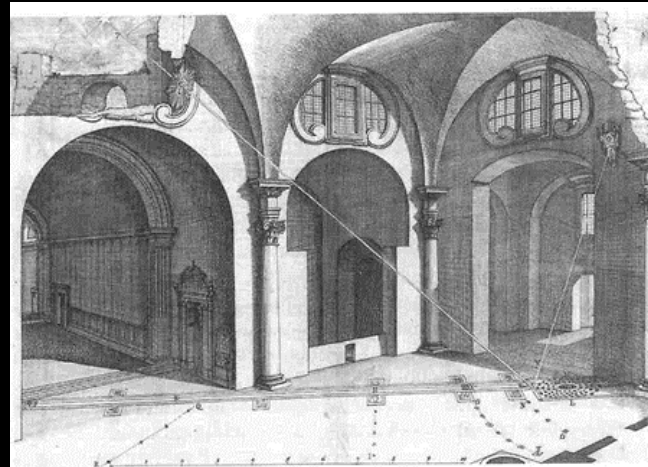

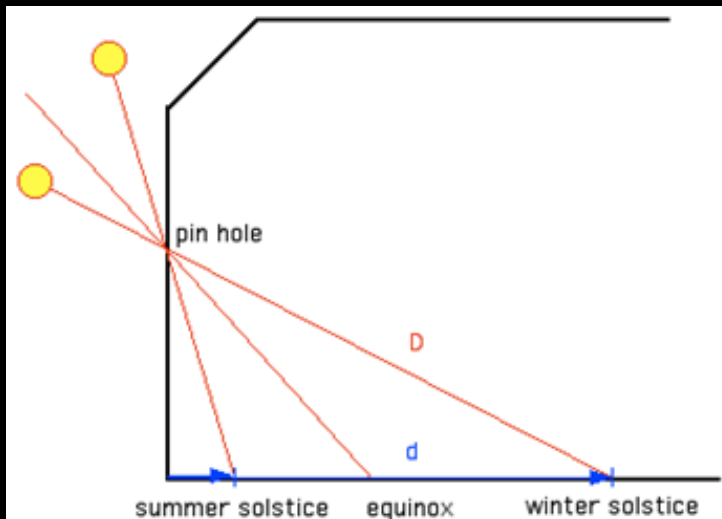

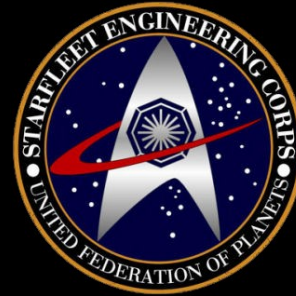
Diagram of Bianchini's meridian, from his De Calendario (1703): the ray on the right comes from the sun, and hits the line at solar noon through the year; the ray on the left is from Polaris



I really can't beat the Wikipedia article's text on this so I am going to use it and add photos. Bianchini's sundial was built along the meridian that crosses Rome, at longitude  $12^{\circ} 30'$  E. At solar noon, which varies according to the equation of time from around 10:54 a.m. UTC in late October to 11:24 a.m. UTC in February [11:54 to 12:24 CET],[2] the sun shines through a small hole in the wall to cast its light on this line each day.



At the summer solstice, the sun appears highest, and its ray hits the meridian line at the point closest to the wall. At the winter solstice, the ray crosses the line at the point furthest from the wall. At either equinox, the sun touches the line between these two extremes. The longer the meridian line, the more accurately the observer can calculate the length of the year. The meridian line built here is 45 meters long and is composed of bronze, enclosed in yellow-white marble

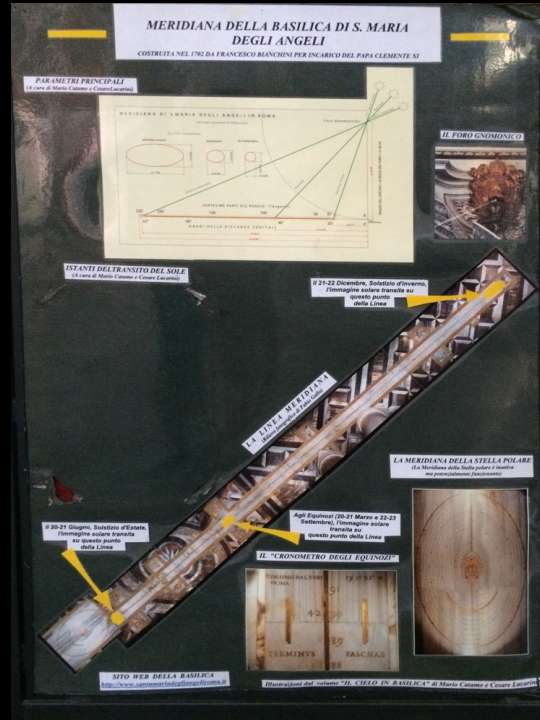

This solar line was the equivalent of the "national observatory" in Rome and was the official determinant of when noon occurred in Rome until accurate clocks were invented.

In addition to using the line to measure the sun's meridian crossing, Bianchini also added holes in the ceiling to mark the passage of stars. Inside the interior, darkened by covering the windows, Polaris, Arcturus and Sirius were observed through these holes with the aid of a telescope to determine their right ascensions and declinations. [3] The meridian line was restored in 2002 for the tricentenary of its construction, and it is still operational today.

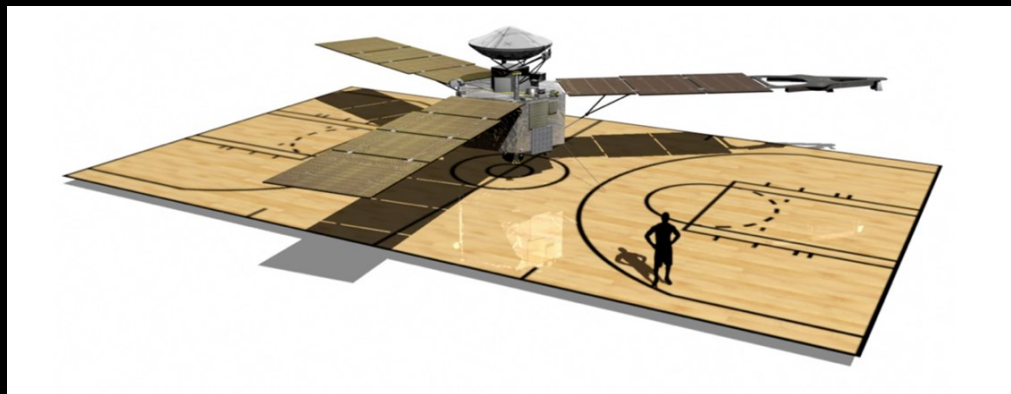
## JUNO Enters Jovian System:

After a decade of development, construction, and flight, NASA/JPL's latest space-probe JUNO has successfully entered orbit around Jupiter! This is no small feat, because the space environment around Jupiter is hostile beyond belief. It has radiation levels so high that it will fry almost any electronic system. So, the engineers at Lockheed Martin (who built the spacecraft) had to literally "armor" the spacecraft with a titanium radiation vault to protect the sensitive computers and instruments. Still, in order to minimize time near Jupiter, Juno is in a highly elongated polar orbit, spending only a few hours in the radiation belts while it collects data, then fourteen days safely transmitting back to Earth. It will cycle this way for the next couple years to understand more about Jupiter's composition and revealing HOW it developed. Why is that important? Because we've learned that Jupiter is the KEY to understanding how the rest of the solar system formed. We believe, but have yet to confirm, that Jupiter ensured that lighter elements necessary for life were "shepherded" into the inner solar system, where they were deposited on the young Earth. Juno will also answer questions about how Jupiter may have migrated toward the Sun in the early years of the solar system, and then back out to where it is now. Scientists believe that Jupiter's move back outward was the result of gravitational interactions with the young Saturn.

You may be surprised to know just how BIG the Juno spacecraft is. It weighed almost 8,000 pounds at launch. It's solar arrays are the most advanced ever used and are huge, almost thirty feet in length. No other spacecraft has travelled that far from the Sun utilizing solar power, hence the need for massive arrays. If you placed Juno on a basketball court, here's what it would look like (note the human to scale):

Carried onboard JUNO are three LEGO minifigures, one representing Galileo Galilei, who holds a model of Jupiter and his telescope. Galileo, you'll recall, was the first to use a telescope for astronomical observations, first to discover Jupiter's four largest moons, and first to discover that the Earth wasn't the center of all things (for example, he proved that there were four large moons orbiting something OTHER than Earth, ending the geocentric bias that held sway until his time). Also included is Zeus (Jupiter in Latin), and Hera (Juno in Latin). Juno, wife of Jupiter, was able to see through the clouds her husband used to conceal his misdeeds (promiscuity). Juno the probe does just that, see through Jupiter's thick clouds to its underlying structure, hence the name. The figures are made of spacecraft grade aluminum, and are meant to inspire kids of all ages to study science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM). - see lower left picture.

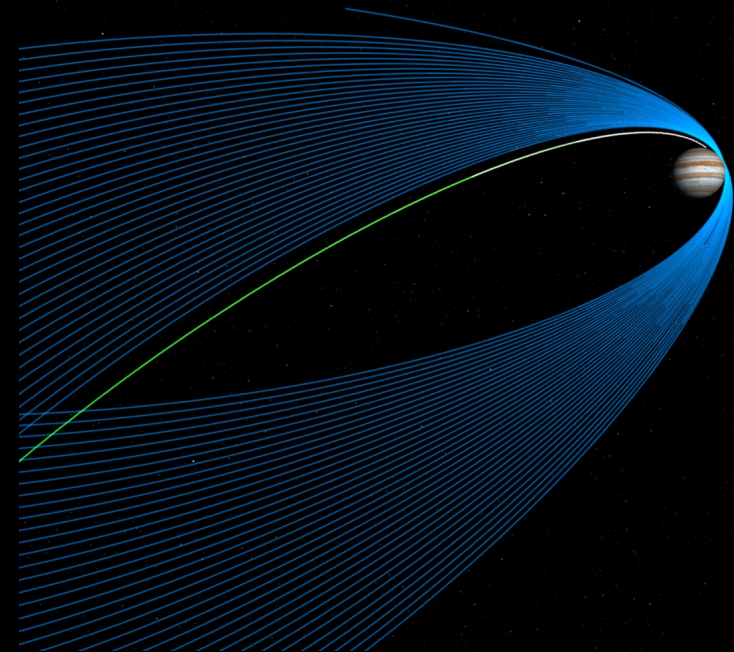

Finally, here's an image of Juno's highly elongated polar orbit, intended to save the spacecraft from prolonged exposure to Jupiter's deadly radiation belts. It will make thirty-seven such orbits before deorbiting and plunging into its atmosphere in late 2018:

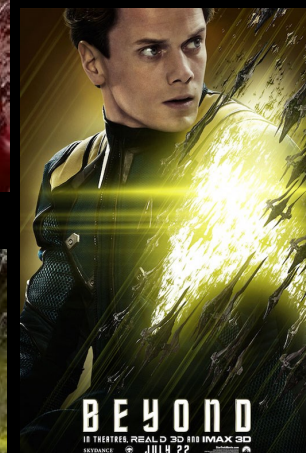

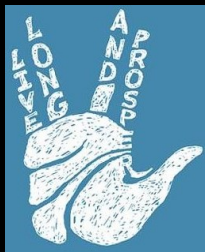

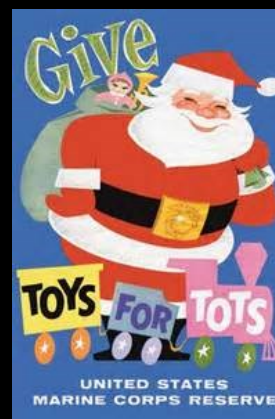

Yelchin was born in St. Petersburg, Russia, and moved with his figure-skater parents, Irina and Viktor Yelchin, to the United States when he was just six months old. He was already one of Hollywood's most-exciting young talents – a screen natural – when he signed on to play Pavel Chekov in *Star Trek (2009)*, having logged film and television credits that included *ER*, *Hearts in Atlantis*, *The Practice*, *Curb Your Enthusiasm*, *Alpha Dog*, *Huff* and *Charlie Bartlett*. Since playing Chekov in the first J.J. Abrams blockbuster, he'd appeared in *Terminator Salvation*, *The Beaver*, *Fright Night*, *Only Lovers Left Alive*, *Experimenter* and the recently released *Green Room*, in which he co-starred with Patrick Stewart. In addition to *Star Trek Beyond*, he'd completed several projects set for release in the near future, among them *We Don't Belong Here*, *Porto*, *Rememory* and *Thoroughbred*.

Back in 2011, StarTrek.com spoke with Yelchin about playing the young Chekov and the likelihood that he'd be playing Chekov over the course of several films. Asked if he felt his version of Chekov served as a bridge to Walter Koenig's, Yelchin replied, "I don't know if it builds to Walter's Chekov, that if we make more films then suddenly it'll totally become that guy. I just think that I tried to capture as close as possible all of the great qualities that Walter brought to his Chekov. So I hope there's a continuity. I don't know if it's necessarily an evolution, but I hope there's a continuity where you can say, 'Oh, yeah, I buy that person being that age.'"
