YouTube is a wonderful tool. Information is readily available in bite sized chunks to alleviate even the most modest of intellectual itches. One of my favorite YouTube channels is Vintage Space. The host, Amy Shira Teitel goes through and answers questions about NASA space missions that you probably never even considered. Examples include: what is the Gimbal lock they keep talking about on Apollo 13, why the gold foil on the bottom of Gemini space crafts, and how did Apollo astronauts sleep on the moon.

By far the most amazing video she's done is the one that asks the question, why you can't see stars in the photographs from the moon. Spoilers: this comes from the fact that the whole purpose of the photos was to take pictures of the moon (that's why we went there in the first place). Since the cameras were film cameras, they had to decide to figure out how much exposure to give the film in order to take clear pictures of the moon's surface. Since the moon was so much brighter than the background, the film exposure was held to a minimum which precluded the light from the stars being able to be imprinted onto the film. However, the video does show one photo from Apollo 16 where they did leave the exposure open long enough to capture the stars, which then immediately lets you know that they made the right decision. Pretty cool, huh?

If you enjoy that, I hope you check out the channel (Scott, in one video she builds the Saturn V rocket from LEGOS), and may you keep on Trekkin' into 2018.

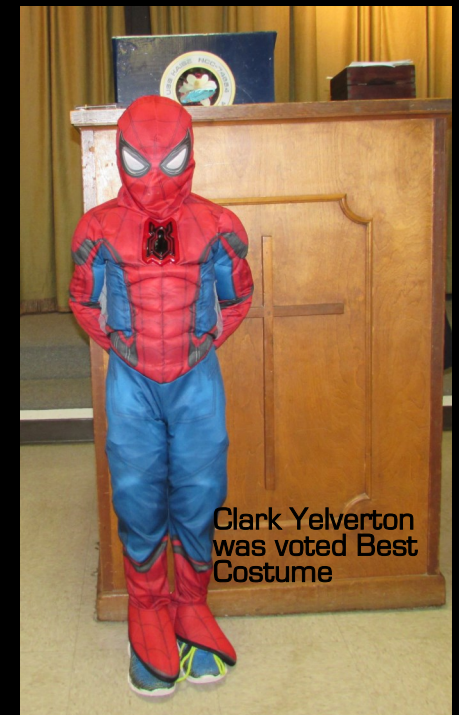

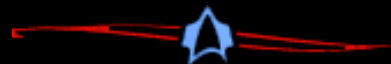

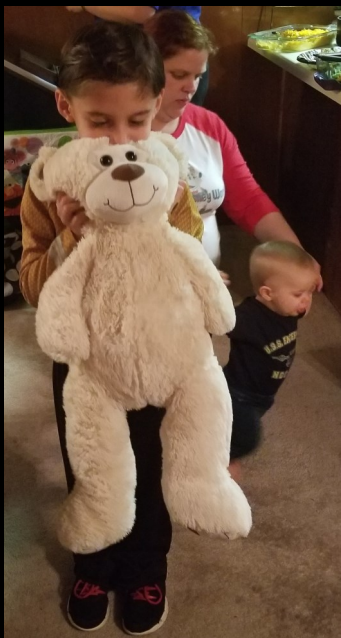

Star Trek Enterprise - Breaking the Ice.



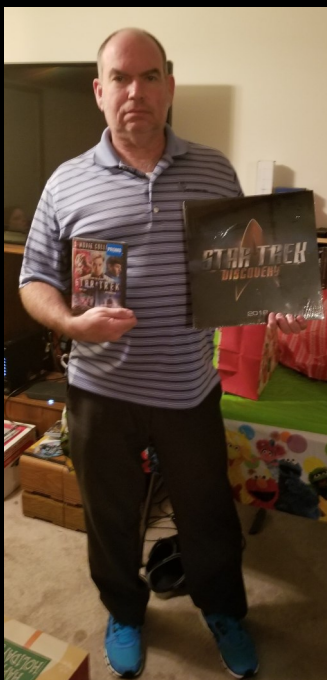

Winner of the 2017 Grand Conceptor Award was the new SR 520 Floating Bridge in Seattle, designed by HDR. This dynamic new 1.5-mile span is the world's longest and largest floating bridge. The superstructure is supported by 21 of the heaviest, widest and deepest longitudinal pontoons ever built, each weighing nearly 11,000 tons.

Further stabilized by 54 supplemental pontoons and cables and anchors, the bridge can resist winds of up to 98 miles per hour and 6.3-foot wave heights or the equivalent of a 100-year storm. The new bridge provides six travel lanes for vehicular traffic, a dedicated transit and high-occupancy vehicle lane in each direction, as well as a 14-foot-wide shared-use pathway for cyclists and pedestrians; it will support the future addition of multimodal transportation

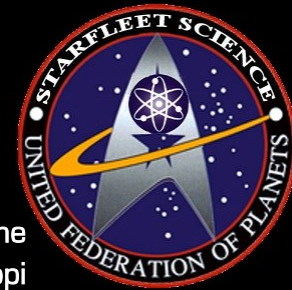

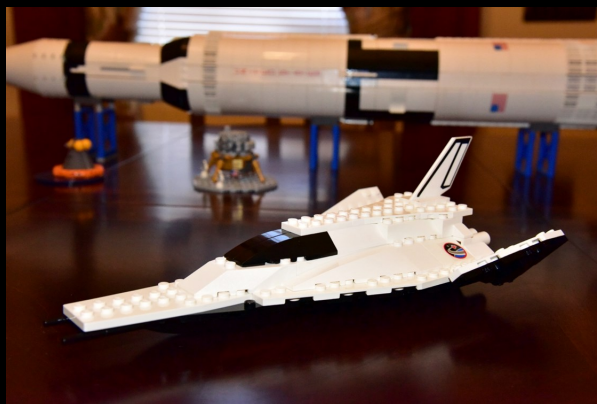


“Orbital SpacePlane” in LEGO:

Wheelchair Safety Program with Jackson's Police Department:

Knowing all-too-well the challenge/danger caused by our lack of accessible sidewalks, I partnered with some friends with Stand Up for Racial Justice to purchase eighty high-visibility vests that Jackson Police Officers can distribute, free of charge, to persons riding their wheelchairs in the street. We had a press conference that explained the program. Basically, JPD will give out a set of two vests to persons they encounter. I also took the opportunity at the press conference to educate the public about the "White Cane Law".

If you know a wheelchair-user in need of these vests, please contact JPD's Northern District Commander James McGowan at: 601-960-1907.

Basically, it means that persons who are blind or otherwise disabled have the right to "...full and free use of the streets, highways, sidewalks, walkways, public buildings, public facilities, and other public spaces" (except interstates, for obvious reasons). Motorists have an obligation to: "...take precautions necessary to the safety of disabled persons...and provide assistance to disabled persons upon appropriate occasions." That usually means yielding to pedestrians using canes, walkers, or wheeled mobility devices as they attempt to cross the street, and giving them a wide berth as they walk/ride along the shoulder.

This year has been full of medical concerns for not only our crew, but our families outside of the crew and even our region. So coming up for each new issue of the Commlink I will be putting out general information about some common ailments we faced, warning signs and ways to take care of yourself. For this issue I am going to start with gallbladders. Most people don't know what a gallbladder is. It is an organ that's main job is to hold the bile necessary for breakdown of fats in the intestines. It is not a necessary organ in a healthy individual. The gallbladder for the most part doesn't have many things that can go wrong. In fact, there are about four different things that can go wrong. Gallstones, Cholecystitis, Gallbladder Cancer or Gallstone

Pancreatitis are the four ailments caused by a malfunctioning gall bladder. Symptoms to look for are abdominal pain, nausea, indigestion or fever about one hour after you eat for gallstones. Upper right abdominal pain for up to six hours after eating and hard to get a deep breath will alert you to Cholecystitis which is usually an infection caused by gallstones. Gallbladder cancer is usually seen with jaundice, pain above the stomach and fever. Gallstone Pancreatitis can give you upper abdominal pain that radiates to your back, fever, tender abdomen or increased heart rate. To keep your gallbladder healthy is just like most things: eat healthy, drink plenty of water, watch the kind of fats you eat. These won't necessarily keep problems away, but they can help.

Security Update:

Happy New Year everyone! I hope everyone had a safe and blessed holiday season! Wow, what a year 2017 has been! With the launching of Star Trek Discovery, the Orville, the new Star Wars Last Jedi Movie, we have been treated to some great science fiction! It's so great to part of a group that shares my love of science fiction and especially Star Trek! Now, in order to be able to enjoy all that 2018 has to offer, we need to keep ourselves happy and healthy. The flu bug has been going around, has hit quite a few members in our group and families as well. It appears to be especially bad in our area, so I want to help by giving some common sense, easy things to do to prevent the flu. As part of Security, I want to offer some tips to keep you and your family happy, safe and healthy in the New Year so be looking for more health, safety and security tips in future articles.

The main way that illnesses like colds and flu are spread is from person to person in the respiratory droplets of coughs and sneezes. Sometimes germs also can be spread when a person touches respiratory droplets from another person on a surface like a desk or other inanimate object.

How to **Stop** the Spread of Germs and Prevent the Flu:

- Cover your mouth and nose when coughing or sneezing -

Cough or sneeze into a tissue and then throw it away. Cover your cough or sneeze if you do not have a tissue. Then, clean your hands, and do so every time you cough or sneeze.

- Avoid touching your eye, mouth, and nose -

Germs are often spread when a person touches something that is contaminated and then touches his or her eyes, nose, or mouth.

- The "Happy Birthday" song helps keep your hands clean?

Not exactly. Yet we recommend that when you wash your hands – with soap and warm water – that you wash for 15 to 20 seconds. That's about the same time it takes to sing the "Happy Birthday" song twice!

- Alcohol-Based Hand Wipes and Gel Sanitizers Work Too - When soap and water are not available, alcohol-based disposable hand wipes or gel sanitizers may be used. If using gel, rub your hands until the gel is dry. The gel doesn't need water to work; the alcohol in it kills the germs on your hands.

- Avoid close contact with people who are sick - The most common way of getting the flu is through contact with others who have the flu

- Stay home when you are sick - No one wants your germs, so please keep them to yourself!

- Get enough sleep, exercise regularly, and eat a healthy diet to keep your defenses up - We encourage you to participate in health and fitness activities!

- If you have a chronic health condition, do everything you can to keep it under control. Be sure to take your medication as prescribed.

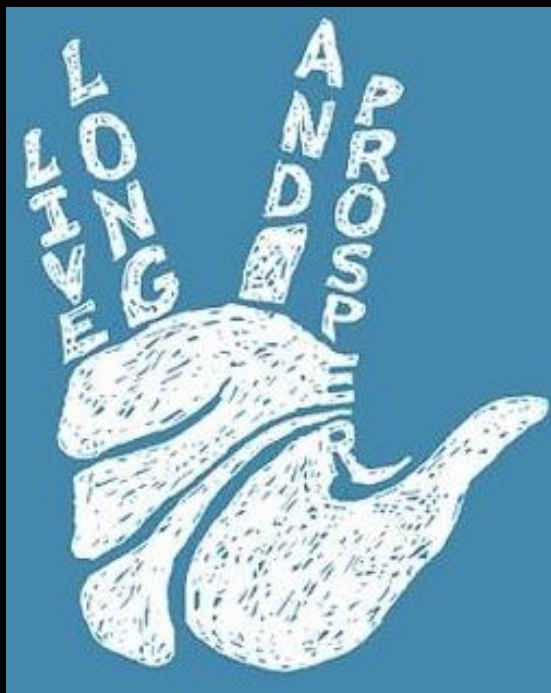
