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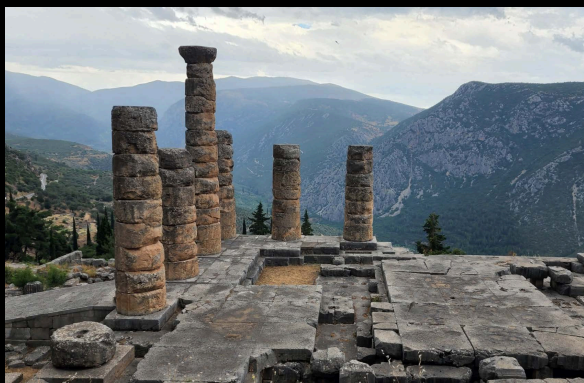

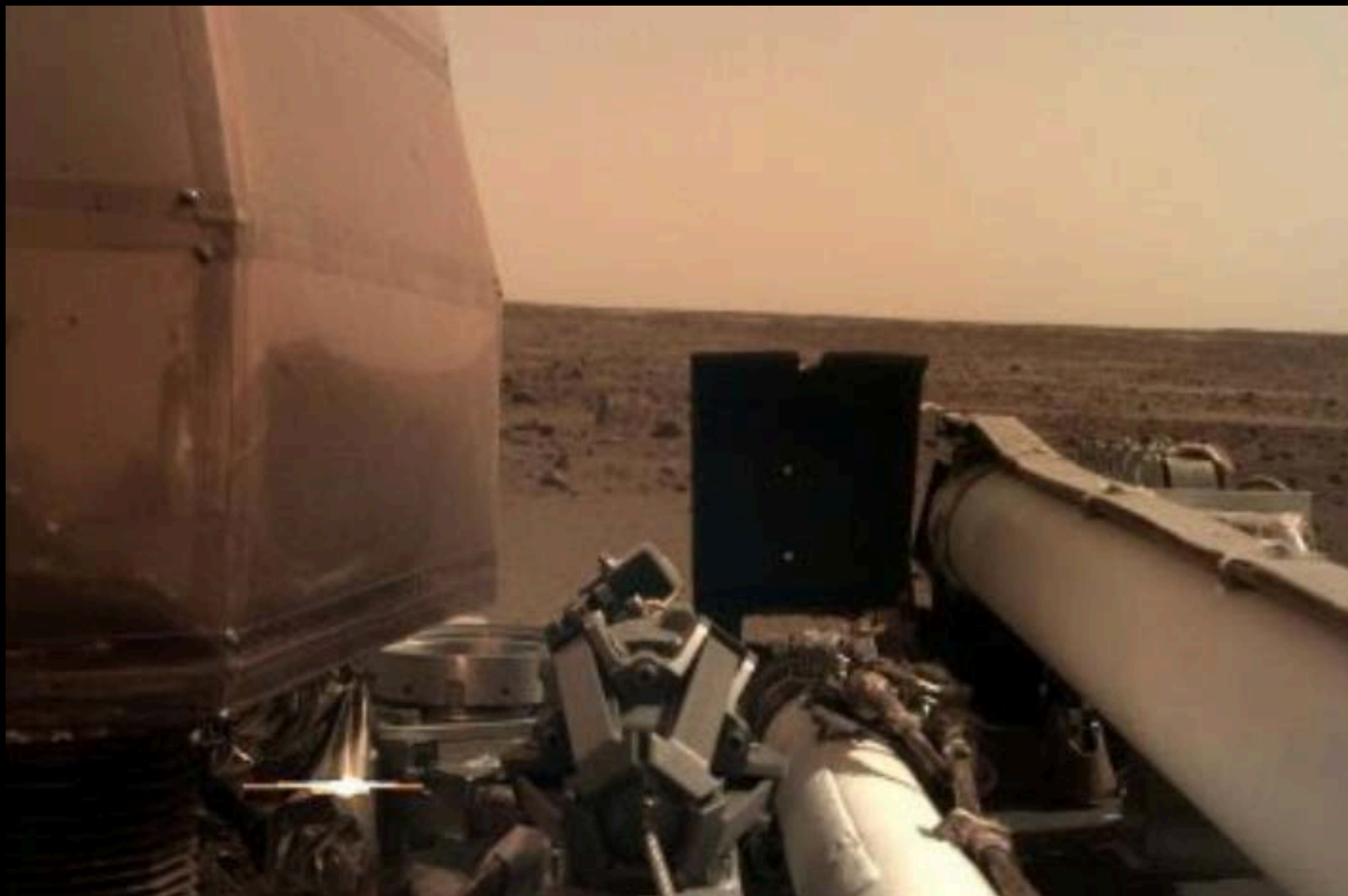

- Wireless Compose-2 Smart Shirt

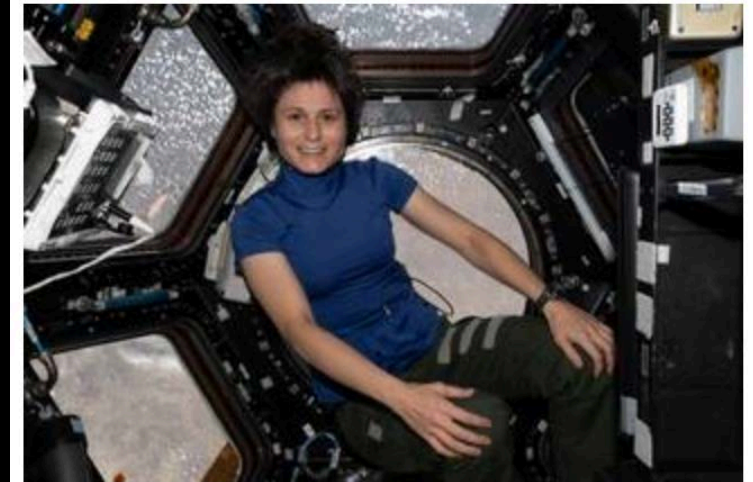

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The Enterprise discovers the USS Exeter in orbit around Omega IV. The crew is revealed to have died except for the captain, who remains on the planet. Kirk, Spock, McCoy, and Unlucky Red Shirt beam down to the planet & find Prime Directive-violating Captain Ronald Tracey. He has made friends with the "Kohms," an "Asiatic" group in conflict with the savage Aryan "Yangs." Tracey thinks he has found a "Fountain of Youth" with the planet's population, but it turns out it's just evolution/natural selection following a devastating war with biological

weapons. It turns out that his crew would have lived if they had stayed on the planet a bit longer. The camera slow pans to the Star Spangled Banner hanging in the corner and credits roll.

Near the end of the episode, viewers are reminded again about the power of words in Kirk's final speech:

"Hear me! Hear this! Among my people, we carry many such words as this from many lands, many worlds. Many are equally good and are as well respected, but wherever we have gone, no words have said this thing of importance in quite this way. Look at these three words written larger than the rest, with a special pride never written before or since. Tall words proudly saying We the People. That which you call Ee'd Plebnista was not written for the chiefs or the kings or the warriors or the rich and powerful, but for all the people! Down the centuries, you have slurred the meaning of the words, 'We, the people of the United States, in order to form a more perfect union, establish justice, ensure domestic tranquility, provide for the common defence, promote the general welfare, and secure the blessings of liberty to ourselves and our posterity, do ordain and establish this constitution.' These words and the words that follow were not written only for the Yangs, but for the Kohms as well!"

"The Omega Glory" may never be a fan favorite (nor should it be!), but it's a reminder that striving for "freedom" should unite us all into striving for the the promise of a better, Star Trek-type future.

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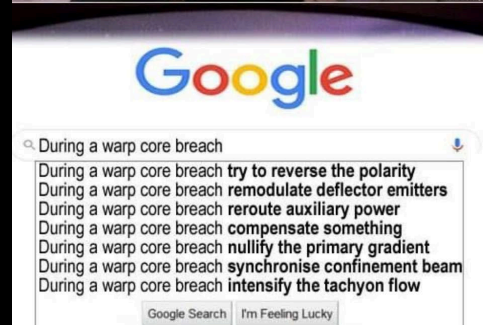

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#### Star Trek: Strange New Worlds – An Opinion

It has been a long wait, but it appears we finally have a consistently good new Star Trek series with Star Trek: Strange New Worlds. The writers of Strange New Worlds appear to have learned from the Star Trek franchise's many successes (especially Deep Space Nine) and corrected the problems from its less-than-stellar properties (Discovery and Picard). The show's writing has returned to the weekly episodic style of The Original Series while keeping the concept of a background story arc that was prevalent in Voyager and Deep Space Nine. Additionally, the writers avoid the staleness of just focusing heavily on one or two

characters and instead do a fantastic job at weaving stories around each of the main characters, whether previously established in canon or not.

The characters of Strange New Worlds are all realistically portrayed as members of a team and not as over-the-top personalities who are one emotional moment away of breaking protocol and going rogue. Everyone has a personality and set of quirks to make each of them unique and interesting yet all of them act professionally, which is something you would expect of a Starfleet crew (looking at you, crew of the Discovery). Among the Enterprise's crew we have Captain Pike: a father-figure who knows how to be serious when in the chair, yet also knows how to relax when in the kitchen donning his apron; Young Uhura, the hyper-competent linguist who is not sure (yet) whether she even belongs in Starfleet; the newly-created Lieutenant Hemmer, a snarky yet insightful (pun intended) Aenar engineer, and Spock, who is finally being properly portrayed as Spock.

Strange New Worlds has also used Star Trek cannon in some fresh ways: integrating the real-life events of January 6th, in Washington D.C. into the Trek timeline was (rather disturbing) genius; re-introducing Spock's half-brother, Sybok, may make for an interesting future story hook (and possibly redeem Star Trek); and recreating the Gorn as some vicious, unseen horror establishes a new series villain and avoids the overused, and Discovery-damaged Klingons.

As a side-note: the re-introduction of the Gorn does sort of nullify the canon Kirk-Gorn fight: Kirk would have probably ended up as Gorn breeding stock.

As the first season comes to a close, I hope that the writers realize that they may have finally created updated Star Trek formula correct, and continue introducing us to new, thoughtful stories on exciting, Strange New Worlds.

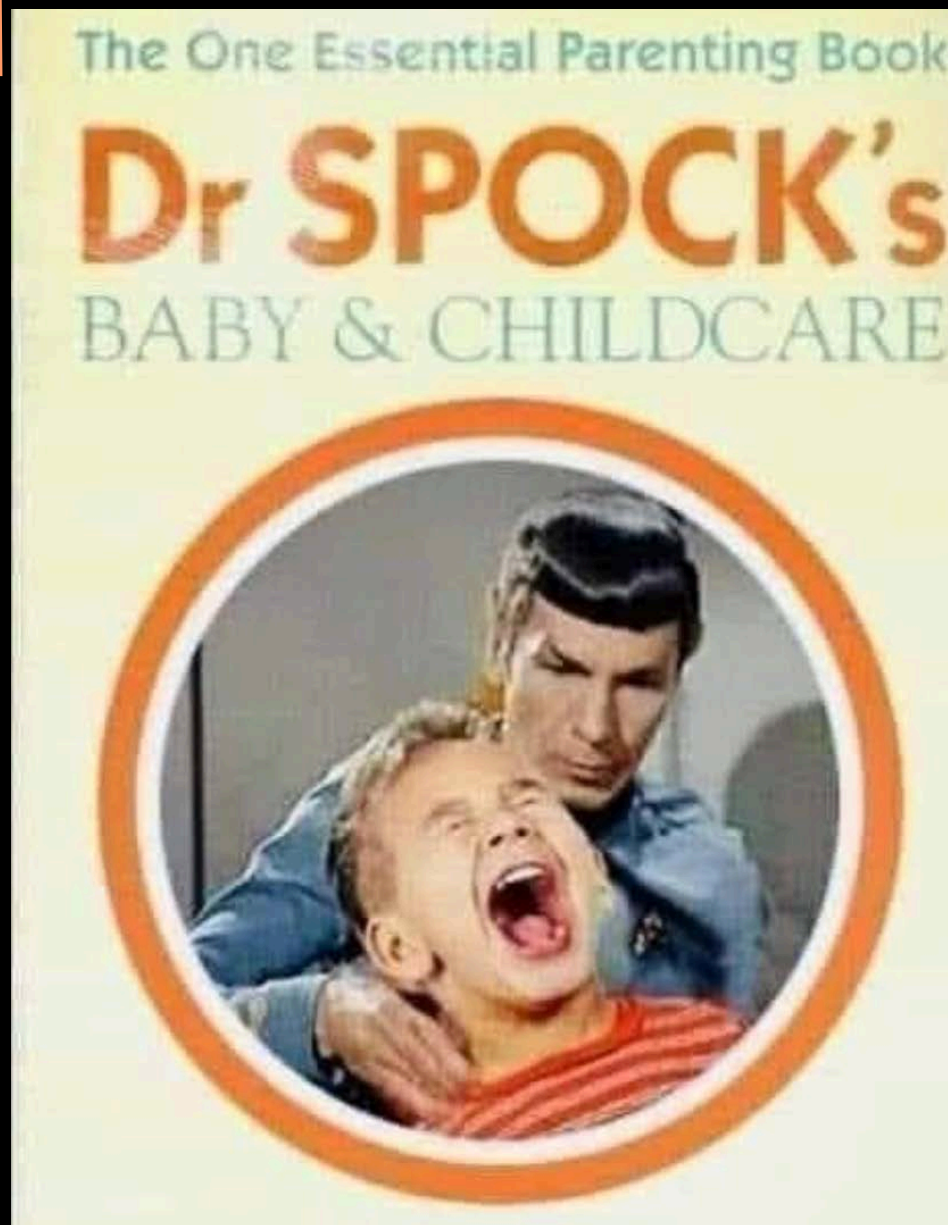

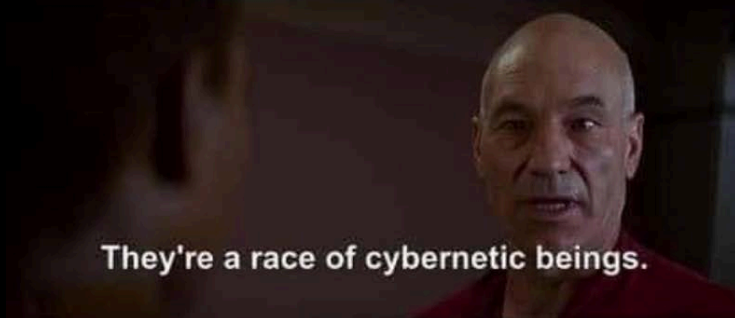
