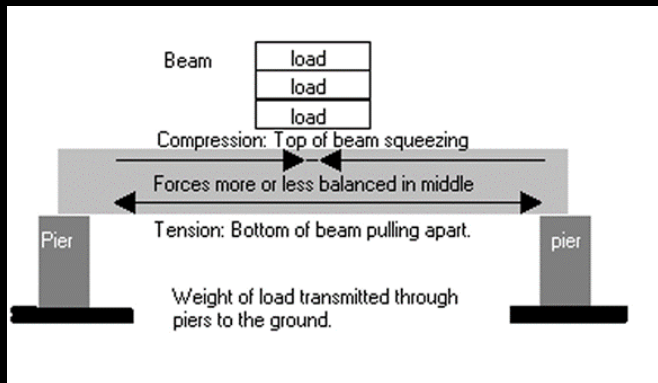


Why I-Beams?

You see them everywhere: bridges, exposed in ceilings, Construction sites. Why do we use I beams so much?

When you place a load on a beam, the top of the beam is compressed and the bottom of the beam is stretched. In the middle, the forces are pretty much balanced out. In short bridges, across small culverts and such, often you will see squared logs being used as the beams. And this works, but is very heavy. If you are building long spans, the weight of the material itself becomes a factor.

The I-beam puts the wood, steel, aluminum or concrete where we need it. That is where the compression and tension forces are the greatest.

The top and bottom gets more material and the thinner middle section simply holds them apart. This creates a stiff and strong beam that saves material (money) and weight. You can even see perforated I beams where the loads are relatively light such as supporting roofs.

Wood I-beams are used in home construction and are often called joists. FYI: The particle board versions have come under scrutiny for losing strength too quickly in fires.

Try this experiment at home. Take a 6 by 12 inch piece of cereal box and cut it into 1x12 pieces. Make an I-beam out of three 1 inch strips with some tacky glue and glue the other three together face to face making a 1x12x3 layer thick piece. Use the same amount of material and glue in each. When it is dry, get a couple



thick books place them 10 inches apart and make two bridges. Stack pennies or matchbox cars on each until it fails (bends).

NASA Working on New EVA Spacesuits:

The Z-2 and PXS Suits are prototype next-generation spacesuits that NASA is currently developing. The PXS (Prototype Exploration Suit) is meant predominantly for in-space extra-vehicular activity (EVA), but could be modified to be used on Mars or other terrestrial body. The Z-2 is specifically designed for planetary use, meaning, it is optimized for walking, bending, kneeling, and hiking long distances, all things necessary for field geology. Both of them are so-called "Hard Suits", meaning the torso region is comprised of a hard shell that twists in various locations to provide flexibility. The forearms, hands, and lower legs remain cloth for increased dexterity. Both of them borrow from Russian technology in that they are one-piece suits that open through a rear hatch at the backpack. This provides the added benefit of stowing the suits OUTSIDE the spacecraft or rover in a "suit-port", preventing sand/dust from contaminating the interior and infiltrating the astronauts' lungs and vehicle systems.

Consultation with US Department of Transportation about Air Travel for People with Disabilities:

The Department of Transportation's Aviation Consumer Protection Division is getting ready to celebrate the thirty-year anniversary of the Air Carrier Access Act of 1986, which is the component of ADA that deals with disability rights for air travelers. As such, they formed a focus group to determine what problems/obstacles limit people with disabilities from flying. The National Multiple Sclerosis Society nominated me to fly to Washington and visit DOT and advocate on behalf of disabled travelers. It was no easy feat, as I had only three days notice, we have no reliable wheelchair accessible transportation to the airport, and our flight was diverted to Charlottesville, VA, due to thick fog. Jackson has only one accessible taxi vehicle (often booked up during the day), Charlottesville had no accessible taxi service at all. After hours of waiting, being assured they'd find an accessible ride (which didn't happen), I finally suggested they get four strong men to lift my 230 lb. chair into the back of a standard van, and reverse the process when we got to Washington, two hours drive away. Ultimately, the meeting with DOT was worth the effort. I shared multiple issues with airline representatives in hopes that they can/will develop better policies/practices that make flying easier for people with disabilities.

How do you recognize the early signs and symptoms of job stress?

Physical signs:

Fatigue, tension headaches, upset stomach, sleep problems, backaches, weight loss, shortness of breath, high blood pressure, muscle tension, nervousness, change in appetite, sweaty palms and cold hands and feet

Emotional signs:

Irritability, hostility, anxiety, loss of self-esteem, withdrawal, inability to appreciate or enjoy life and substance abuse.

There are ways to avoid or reduce job stress. Here are some of the steps you can take.

Maintain good health habits:

Exercise regularly, eat right, get enough sleep, don't abuse alcohol, drugs.

Use your time wisely:

Don't overdo it; don't procrastinate; be aware of yourself and what you are doing; make a list and prioritize.

Improve your work habits:

Identify your sources of stress – which are you creating and which are created by others, adjust your work environment, discuss any problems with your boss or co-workers and work to resolve them, manage your time wisely, be positive, be realistic.
