





'Star Trek' Lives Long and Prospers on 50th Anniversary

"Star Trek" has lived long and prospered.

Fifty years ago Thursday Gene Roddenberry's visionary TV series debuted on NBC. It was not an instant success — in fact, it was canceled just three years later — but a famously devoted fan base kept the sci-fi epic alive and it has since spawned numerous hit TV spin-offs and over a dozen blockbuster films that have dominated the box office for 35 years.



The show, which followed the exploits of a 23rd century crew of interstellar explorers (working for the fictional United Federation of Planets, or "Federation"), distinguished itself with its intricate plotlines that often featured prescient social commentary, and its colorful cast of characters including the logical half-human Spock, the compassionate Dr. "Bones" McCoy and the purely passionate Captain James T. Kirk.

And, like so many other pop culture phenomenon, fans have projected all sorts of sociopolitical meanings onto "Star Trek" in the decades since it first aired...

Watching Star Trek was so exciting because there you see what great possibilities lay ahead for future space exploration - we can dream! I loved the characters. My favorite was always Mr. Spock. I grew to love Star Trek more and more with each new series and movies that developed over the years. And after meeting Glenn, my husband who loved all sci-fi also, we began a great collection of everything Star Trek collectibles. Then we later discovered the Creation Entertainment Star Trek Conventions held Las Vegas, NV and have attended several. WOW! I was so excited to finally get to meet so many of the Star Trek actors. From The University of Mississippi Medical Center, Jackson, Mississippi

As the Star Trek franchise celebrates 50 years of taking fans to the far reaches of the galaxy, we would like to pay tribute to one of UMMC's most famous graduates - although, he won't officially be a student here for another 233 years.

Leonard McCoy, Chief Medical Officer of the USS Enterprise, graduated from the University of Mississippi in 2249, followed by his getting his M.D. at UMMC in 2253.

"Bones" has always been noted as a Georgia native and multiple degree recipient of Ole Miss, but this information was cemented in Star Trek history during a 1996 time-travel episode of Star Trek: Deep Space Nine, one of the original series' many spin-offs, titled "Trials and Tribble-ations." A DS9 crew member, Dax, remembers meeting him around 2245 during her visit to the Oxford campus.


