When I took over as captain of the USS Haise in 2014, it was a very daunting task. I had always been told that when you take charge of something, you must always leave it in the same or better condition than it was when you found it. The problem was, I was taking over for Lucy Ferron. She had won the Starfleet International CO of the year twice in 2005 and 2009. She had won Region 2 CO of the year three times in 2005, 2009 and 2012. Most of all, she led the Ship to winning Starfleet International Ship of the Year in 2006, and Region 2 Ship of the Year in 2006, 2007, 2008, and 2012. I honestly didn't know who you could possibly maintain that excellence, let alone attempt to improve on it.

My confidence was bolstered a little, when we won the Region 2 Ship of the Year Award in my first year of 2014, and I was doubly excited when we won it again in 2017. That being said, nothing compared to the joy of winning the Starfleet International Ship of the Year Award in 2017 as well. I found myself staring at that award with loving eyes which I normally only reserve for my family. I was pleased and honored and grateful to have won that award, but I, of course, didn't do it alone. Everything that you all have done for this Ship and the charities which we support is what has enabled us to win these awards. I was simply the leader, but the leader is nothing if no one follows.

Lucy Ferron served the USS Haise for nearly ten years, and we won Ship of the Year in four of those ten years. That's a Ted Williams batting average of .400. I have now served the USS Haise for nearly five years, and we have won Ship of the Year in two of those five years. We might win in 2018 too! The results won't be announced until May. Regardless, I can successfully say that with your help, I have maintained the standard of excellence which Lucy Ferron helped set for us. I may have even upped the bar, we won't know until May, so Ryan Case now has his own big shoes to fill, and possibly bigger.




Message from Chief of Communications - Lt. Commander Barbara Allen

Message from Chief of Operations - Lt. Commander Clay Bartunek



Message from Chief of Engineering - Admiral Bethany Theilman



Happy New Year!

New Horizons flew past distant 2014 MU69, nicknamed "Ultima Thule."

Humankind has now taken pictures of a "snowman" 4 BILLION miles from our home. Props to NASA engineers and support staff who are continuing to work in spite of the government shutdown because otherwise they would have missed the rendezvous Dec. 31, 2018 and Jan. 1, 2019 (New Years Eve and Day) as New Horizons flew past distant 2014 MU69. The object was nicknamed "Ultima Thule." after review of more than 34,000 suggestions from the public, it means "beyond the borders of the known world." (Thule is pronounced "TOO-lee.")



The New Horizons spacecraft will continue downloading images and other data in the days and months ahead, completing the return of all science data over the next 20 months. New Horizons launched in January 2006, and is expected to return Kuiper belt data until 2021.

When Launched, the instruments available to New Horizons Mission Control were:

Visible and infrared imager/spectrometer (RALPH)

Ultraviolet imaging spectrometer (ALICE)

Radio science experiment for studying atmospheres (REX)

Telescopic camera (LORRI)

Solar wind and plasma spectrometer (SWAP)

Energetic particle spectrometer (PEPSSI)

Space dust counter (SDC)

TRIP TO SAN FRANCISCO

In mid-October, I travelled to San Francisco, CA, for a meeting with transportation network company UBER executives and legal counsel to try to convince them to provide service to people who need wheelchair vans. Currently, UBER is resisting the clear mandate of the Americans with Disability

Act to provide "equivalent service" to people of all abilities, including those that need ramp or lift-equipped vehicles. UBER is fighting this in court, claiming they don't purchase vehicles (not true) and that they are only a "software company." It will be years before we know the outcome in the case.




SICK BAY
